Our Mission

Mentorvation was established in 2021 to create life-changing opportunities for young people through initiatives which include; empowering mentorship, impactful workshops, and tailored intervention activities. Mentorvation is keenly aware of the often, detrimental impact of school and social exclusion, crime and youth violence.

Mentorvation believes that it is crucial for young people to define, understand and take accountability for their role in their communities. Which in turn, will facilitate more effective decision making thus positively impacting not only the lives of young people but also the wider community.

Our Work

Our projects have supported and built stronger relationships between families, young people, children and the wider community. We have increased the number of children and young people who are able to access educational, recreational, and employment opportunities. Creating safe spaces for interventions, activities,

information and access to services, such as mentoring, counselling, and external agencies. The impact of COVID-19 and now the cost of living crisis has disrupted basic needs and services, so we want to continue to create a network of support and resources that the community can rely on in these trying times.




